

Introduction

Aim:

In March 2018, the United Kingdom and the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia signed an education agreement and launched the UK-KSA Education Partnership. The UK-KSA Education Steering Committee identified higher education as one of the priority areas of collaboration, including scientific research & innovation and transnational education.

Recent announcements from the Saudi Ministry of Education encourage Saudi universities to forge partnerships with international higher education institutions and international institutions to operate in Saudi Arabia.

The Education Leaders Roundtable will bring together senior officials from higher education institutions in both countries to discuss opportunities and challenges of collaboration.

The roundtable will include two panel discussion sessions between senior officials with a Q&A session at the end of each panel. Research & Innovation and TNE Working Groups will be announced at the virtual roundtable.

He was previously Professor of International Politics at the University of Wales, Aberystwyth, as well as Head of the Department of International Politics, and Director of the Centre for Public Choice Studies at the University of East Anglia

Professor Nasser Al-Ageeli

Deputy Minister for Research & Innovation, Ministry of Education, KSA

Prof. Al-Aqeeli is the Deputy Minister for Research & Innovation in the Ministry of Education in Saudi Arabia. He was holding previously the position of Vice Rector for Research at King Fahd University of Petroleum & Minerals & CEO of the Dhahran Valley Knowledge Company (a university owned company). He has published over 100 journal publications in his area of specialization in reputed journals in addition to 35 conference proceedings. He is engaged in research grants exceeding 120 Million SR supported by King Abdulaziz City for Science and Technology, Saudi Aramco, King Fahd University of Petroleum & Minerals and Lockheed Martin Aircraft Industries. He obtained 17 patents registered with the US Patent Office (USPTO), in addition to 3 patents registered in the Gulf Patent Office. Prof Chas Bountra

Pro-Vice-Chancellor for innovation, University of Oxford, UK

Chas is Pro-Vice Chancellor for Innovation at the University of Oxford, Professor of Translational Medicine in the Nuffield Department of Clinical Medicine, Director of the Centre for Medicines Discovery, and Professorial Fellow at Keble College, Oxford. Prior to coming back to Oxford in 2008, Chas was Vice President and Head of Biology at GlaxoSmithKline. Chas is an invited expert on several government and charitable research funding bodies, and an advisor for many academic, biotech and pharma drug discovery programmes. In 2012 he was voted one of the "top innovators in the industry", in 2014 received the "Rita and John Cornforth Award" from the Royal Society of Chemistry, in 2017 and 2018 was voted "Master of the Bench" from the Medicine Maker Power List, and in 2018 was awarded the "Order of the British Empire" in the New Years Honours List.

Professor Richard Davies

Pro-Vice-Chancellor, Global, Newcastle University, UK

Professor Richard Davies is a petroleum geologist who started his career in the mining industry of South Africa. After his degree and PhD, he worked in the oil and gas sector, spending 8 years in the petroleum industry in Aberdeen, London and Houston with ExxonMobil working on development and exploration projects. He moved from Houston to Cardiff in 2003 as a senior lecturer and then moved to Durham University in 2006 as a Professor. In 2009 he became Professor of Energy and Director of Durham Energy Institute in 2011 Dean of Knowledge Exchange and Impact. In 2014 he joined Newcastle University where he is Pro-Vice Chancellor, Global. He is now working on the risks associated with fracking within a pan-European consortium 'ReFINE' (Researching Fracking in Europe) that he leadsthe "Order of the British Empire" in the New Year's Honours List.





Prof Stephen Flint

Associate Vice-President International, University of Manchester, UK

Professor Stephen Flint is responsible for the University of Manchester's global engagement strategy in research and education. He works closely with colleagues across all Faculties in the University to build global strategic partnerships with universities, government agencies and industry. He served as inaugural Chair of the Universities UK International Pro Vice Chancellors Network from 2016 to 2018.

Stephen's own research group works on reconstructing the history of sedimentary basins through earth history. This helps us to understand the effects of climate change and tectonic activity in deep time. Applications include exploration for new gas reserves in the transition from oil to renewable energy sources and forecasting of future environmental change He has authored over 150 articles with global collaborators.

Dr. Hani Choudhry is an Associate Professor of Genomics and the founder/co-director of King Abdulaziz University (KAU(- Oxford University Center for Artificial Intelligence in Precision Medicines, Saudi Arabia.

Dr. Choudhry completed his DPhil in Clinical Medicine from the University of Oxford under mentorship of Prof. Sir Peter Ratcliffe (Nobel Laureate in Physiology or Medicine). He has published more than 80 scientific publications in international journals, including PNAS, Cell, Nature Medicine, JBC and EMBO. He has receive several international and prestigious awards for his scientific research including two AACR Scholar-in-Training Award, the Susan G. Komen for the Cure Award, the ASHG/Charles J. Epstein Trainee Award for Excellence in Human Genetics Research (SF), the Professional Achievement Award and the National Cancer Research Institute (NCRI) Prize Award. He was awarded

the UAE International Genetic Disorders Prevention Award 2017-2016 - Scientific Excellence Award in GCC. **Dr. Choudhry's** current scientific interests focus on developing novel omics technologies, and the integration of both clinical and pathological information with data generated from high-throughput molecular, in addition, applying advance artificial intelligence techniques for drug discovery.


